PASTOR'S COLUMN

REV. DR. ROBERT COOK Interim Pastor

Welcome to the year of our Lord, 2024. It will take a week or so to start writing "2024" instead of the previous year. But we do this every year. So, what might the Bible say about entering the new year? We do well to go to Psalm 100:4

"Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name."

As we start the new year, this Bible verse about new beginnings reminds us of the importance of giving thanks to God and learning to love God in the person of Jesus. This begs the question of how do we love one whom we've never seen? After all, we live in a physical reality and that is our orientation.

We love characters in a book. And we love characters in a movie we like. But how are we to love God?

We certainly benefit from rituals in worship. Hymns, prayers, confessions and scripture provide a framework. And especially the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion feature large in our private and public worship.

The first step towards learning to love God is to respond to God's steadfast love for us. Scripture uses the word "**steadfast**" in many places, especially in the Old Testament. It is the nature of God to love and not change the divine mind about us. So, through scripture, we do not see God as an imperious judge. Instead, we see God as a lover whose love will never let us go.

Living in a world of physical reality requires a spiritual focus to learn to love God. Along with poets and song writers, I have found that developing my sense of awe and wonder draws me closer to God. Nature offers so much inspiration if only we will stop to look. And the more you look in wonder, the greater sense of awe you'll experience in the natural creation.

The Psalms are helpful if we read them with care. They connect the physical and spiritual together with the sense of awe and wonder at God's handiwork. In fact, all scripture is helpful in pointing us to God when we don't just plow through it as if we are doing it like a chore. It is best when we take time and read contemplatively. You may stay focused on a word or phrase or just one verse. Trust that God's Spirit is there with you in the reading.

Developing the spiritual awareness of God's presence present with you also deepens the sense of love for God. You grow to love God the same way you grow to love anyone in the day to day, give and take of a relationship. For real love is the deep orientation of your life with the life of another.

Theologically speaking, scripture and Christian experience teach us that God is present to us in the sacraments. In baptism, it is God doing the action. And in Holy Communion, the real presence of the risen Christ is present with us in the bread and the cup. As we open ourselves to this truth, we sense experientially its reality. For we are not observing a death upon a cross, but a resurrection from the grave and the promise that as Jesus lives, so too, will we live in his presence now and when our lives here are done, we will be in his presence forever.

And when we recall his sacrifice for us, we see beyond the cruelty and the injustice to a love that is stronger than death. God has given to us the Holy Spirit, who conveys God's presence to us and that is the "deposit" as Scripture states in II Corinthians 5:5. It takes time and quiet time at that, to grow to experience God's presence with us. But it is not difficult at all. The Psalmist reminds us, "Be still and know that I am God." (Ps 46:10)

So, it is a new year for us. And the way to begin is start quietly by reflecting on your life over the past year and how you have been guided through it. Meditating on God's steadfast love and faithful to you and yours and trusting that God will be there with you in this new year will inspire you, fill you with hope and head you in the direction of deepening your love for God.

I hope that your holiday season was truly memorable and wishing you all a very blessed New Year!

A brief update on our activities:

PROJECTS STARTED:

• I am sure that most of you are aware and feeling the burden of rising costs, the same is true for our church. As we have recently been informed by our insurance provider of increases not only in premiums, but our deductibles and likely will see increases in our utility expenses, please be mindful when using the church to make sure the exit doors are locked, required interior doors remain closed and the lights are turned off when you leave the building. Thanks!!

 We have received a quote from TelePlus to complete the annual inspection of the alarm system. This inspection identifies any issues with the system and its components and its successful completion generates a compliance report to meet the NFPA72 guidelines. This year's quote had some options to achieve some cost savings during the inspection process. Both the committee and Session members approved an option, so this work will be completed sometime in the early part of 2024.

PROJECTS COMPLETED:

- With the completion of the HVAC installation work in the Educational wing, the window AC units are no longer needed. The Session has approved of their disposal. If anyone is interested in one of these units, please contact the Office Manager. Here is a brief summary of the AC units:

- As you know and was mentioned in the October newsletter, the parking lots were damaged in early September. After several attempts, we were finally able to connect with the insurance company and completed the requested Incident Report of what transpired. It has been submitted to them and we have had contact with the insurance adjuster. We have received written notice from the insurance adjuster that the liability investigation is still pending, but we have not received any additional information since last month.

We are so pleased with our youth for their willingness to continue to serve their church.








