**PASTOR’S COLUMN**

**REV. DR. ROBERT COOK** *Interim Pastor*

**How does intercessory prayer differ from other forms of prayer?**

Talking with God through prayer is basic to our relationship with God and with each other. I don’t think we go far enough in teaching about prayer and the many forms of prayer.

As you develop your prayer life you come into a deeper relationship. It is a place of beauty and words spoken from the depth of the soul. It is communion on the most intimate level and creates a bond of trust that is not easily broken. You see, prayer is based on the first commandment. It is the process of becoming one in heart and spirit with God through Jesus.

There are many kinds of prayer and prayers. There are praises, prayers of thanksgiving, prayers of petition, contemplative prayers where silence is observed so as to hear from God, prayers of repentance, prayers for guidance and intercessory prayers.

Intercession is something else entirely. It is an act of selflessness. A choice to step into a situation that requires you to come along side another’s struggle and stand between them and God when that is the most important thing to do. Intercessory prayer is not the same as prayers for yourself, or for 'enlightenment', or for spiritual gifts, or for guidance, or any personal matter, or any glittering generality.

Intercession is not just praying for someone else's needs.

Intercession is praying with the real hope and real intent that God would step in and act to end injustice, or to perform some vital and necessary act that no one else is able to do. It is trusting God to act, even if it's not in the manner or timing we seek. God wants us to ask, even urgently. It is casting our weakness before God's strength, and (at its best) having God's passion burn in us.

### **Jesus is the best example of an intercessor.**

In John chapter 17, he interceded in prayer for God to bless and protect His followers. At the cross, He prayed for his executioners and for the jeering crowd, praying, "Father, *forgive them, for they know not what they do.*" Indeed, Jesus' entire life, his whole reason for being born, was to be a living intercession, laying down his life out of love for God and us to span the rift caused by our rebellion against God. Others followed Jesus' example. Stephen's last words were an intercession on behalf of those who were actually killing him.

Paul also prayed prayers of intercession for the struggling young church, for character, behavior, witness, and wisdom. It is Paul's regular intercession for the church and its people which sets the usual pattern for our own intercessory prayers. In his letter to Philemon, Paul wrote that Epaphras was the 'prayer wrestler' for the church in Colossae. (Phil 1:23)

At its very beginning, the early church was praying for people: for safe travel, praying that people might know Christ through other peoples' witness, praying for healing and health, for rescue, for wisdom, for childbirth, for spiritual growth, for marriages -- asking God to bring benefit or blessing to people other than themselves. The others were not always beloved; they prayed for their political leaders, some of whom were out to kill them. But they knew their God was merciful and was intimately involved with what was going on in the world. They knew they were called by God to share in that involvement.

**The place where intercessory prayer must start is with you and I.** Our Wednesday morning prayer circle has been in intercessory prayer for many years, because six and seven years ago, as things at GPC were in a downturn, this group understood that the way up is by intercessory prayer. We all owe them our appreciation for their faithfulness. God has heard their prayer and GPC is in a far better place as God's Spirit has been actively doing a wonderful work among us.

It's great to know that others may be stepping up for someone before God, but God wants you and I to stand in the gap, putting something of ourselves on the line. God desires for us to be real and to make a difference, not just talk about it.

Our private devotions are not just for our own benefit. If God's love is at work in us, we will begin to see the needs beyond our doors and we will see ways we can care about others. Our love for them will lead us to take it to the ultimate Source of strength, healing, and love. Don't be fearful; be persistent and stubborn. God doesn't mind; God likes to see divine love at work in us. God honors our part in the relationship. Intercessory prayer also changes us as we pray. We begin to see a bigger, clearer picture of what God is doing among us.

### **Let me suggest four simple ways to begin to practice intercessory prayer.**

*Be open and educate yourself about specific needs.*

At one time I spent a day each month with the nuns at a Carmelite abbey. I was surprised they had a television. They explained that they watched the evening news so they could better pray for those in places of great need around the world.

*Pray as specifically as possible.* God is not interested in repetition, but in the heartfelt way you care for someone or some situation and pour yourself in prayer over it.

*And of course, ask that God's will is done.*

*Finally, you might be a part of God's answer to prayer.* Look for ways God might want to use you.

If you are interceding for one who is ill, come up with practical ways where you can be the hands and heart of Christ to them. If you cannot be with one in need, such as in a distant place, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is a very secure way to donate and provide relief to those in troubled areas or facing disasters.

As we think about how many people, three generations now, that have had little to no connection to a Christian congregation, praying for them to know the love of God in Christ is a way where we, as intercessors, open our eyes, ears and hearts to others in their struggles. Many non-churched people have developed opinions about Christians as judgmental, angry and difficult people. That may be true in some cases, but not at GPC. As you and I pray, God will guide. And God will provide ways to share the grace we know in Christ.

Thanks to Brian Rice and Bryan Larew for their assistance with the Spring Clean-up at the Church grounds and at the Moss Spring Cemetery. With the cool temperatures, we limited our efforts to some weed trimming and a stump removal at the Church and there were many downed branches out at Moss Spring.

A brief update on our activities:

### PROJECTS STARTED:

At our request, Session approved the hiring of Musselman's Plastering LLC to help make some repairs to the moisture damaged areas in the west vestibule stairwell. If you recall, Craig Musselman's crew was used to repair the damaged area in the Sanctuary ceiling last year. After completion of the plaster repair, the walls and ceiling were primed and painted to match the previous color.

### PROJECTS COMPLETED:

After the repaving of the parking lot, there were quite a few depressions between the surface of the asphalt and the grade of the church lawn, we purchased a half-yard of sifted topsoil and filled in these depressions and reseeded. With some of the leftover topsoil, we tried to fill in some of the grade mismatch between the east sidewalk and the lawn.

We have treated the church lawn for grubs and insects. Also, Fred Davison has treated the church yard for weeds.

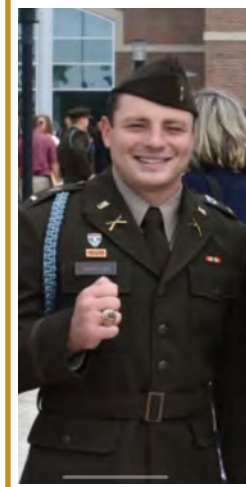
