# Thanksgiving Dinner

We would like to thank everyone who helped make this year's Thanksgiving Dinner outreach another huge success. Whether you donated food, helped make dinners, packed dinners, handed them out, or donated money to purchase turkeys, we could not have coordinated this outreach without you.

CIVIC PARTICIPATION: Albert was elected to the Borough of Greencastle Council in 2022 and served as Council President for years 2022 and 2023.

From approximately 1992 to 2000 Albert was on the Board of Directors for the Boys and Girls Club of Washington County MD. He served as President of the Board from 1994 to 1996 with a goal to expand the club from one location in Hagerstown to multiple locations in the county.

He did structural engineering design for temporary bridges for the Corp of Engineers, highway bridges for various states, and subway structures for the Washington DC transit authority.

He obtained his Professional Engineering License in 1978 in multiple states and retained these licenses until 2023.

CONSTRUCTION CAREER & BUSINESS OWNERSHIP: Between 1980 and 1989 Albert worked for several construction companies in MD where he did project management, cost estimating, and provided pre-construction services.

In 1989 Albert founded Antietam Construction, Inc. in Hagerstown MD and continues to serve as President. Between 1989 and 2003 Antietam performed concrete construction, bridge construction, and commercial construction projects including offices, churches, schools, detention facilities, and manufacturing. These projects were for the private sector as well as for local, state, and the federal government in the states of MD, WV, and PA

In 2003 Antietam changed its core business to become a concrete pump rental company and continues to provide this service to residential concrete foundation contractors in the tri-state. **Diane Mills** I've attended GPC since 2008. I became a member after many years of attending children's programs with my kids (now college students). Officially, I have been on the Board of Deacons, Nominating Committee and involved with Christian Education.
