As I write this it is -1°F outside. I'm grateful for a warm home and cars that start up the first time and a lot of other things. But there are still two months of winter ahead—including the entire month of February. So, what is there to love about February? I've had to do some thinking. Think along with me.

God made all of the seasons. Each one has its own good and peculiar characteristics. Items Discussed

2025 Budget Planning

The committee met to review and plan the Mission budget for 2025. The committee has \$21,000 for this year. Each account and designated fund were reviewed and amounts of money determined. Some new missions were added and some were removed from the budget.

New missions/ministries added under account code 055305 Miscellaneous Mission (GF Giving) include Pregnancy Ministries and Maranatha Ministry.

Missions/ministries removed from the Mission budget include Young Life of Franklin County and Angel Tree which was moved to Christian Education committee.

Candace will give all of the current budget numbers to Bonnie Speaks.

The committee also reviewed the Outreach and Special events budgets which had already been approved. That total budget was \$4400 which included Old Home Week.

Old Business:

Disasters – National – encourage donations through Presbyterian Disaster Relief

Local – Members/Friends of the church or those with a Greencastle address - \$500 donation will be provided through the Transient/Emergency fund that falls within the Mission Budget.

JoAnne will seek information on \$2000 that was donated to MASF.

Brian will purchase a \$500 gift card from Weiss for the family with the recent home loss due to fire. The gift card will be given to the Mayor or the Fire Chief for delivery.

Funds to cover new tires for a person in need were approved. Pastor Bob will complete the purchase order and deliver those funds.

New Business:

Laurel Mission trip presentation will be held Feb 16 during worship. Polly will be the presenter. Mary Ann will let Sue Miller know to add that to the worship bulletin.

Tub of Warmth is overflowing with wonderful donations, even some that are handmade! Debra has placed a tub at the library. Polly and Candace will hand out items during food pantry hours on Wednesday mornings and Thursday evenings.

MASF review process for applications is April 1-May 15. Applications are online and Bonnie will be asked to provide the amount of dollars available. The high school guidance counselor will be notified that our application is available for completion.

Polly Coulter has volunteered to become the new Chair of the Mission/Outreach committee after Candace asked to step down from this position last month. Thank you, Polly!

Mary Ann closed the meeting in prayer.

Property & Maintenance: ACTION: Approved setting the thermostat for the Sanctuary to 65 degrees during cooler months and 78 degrees during warmer months.

Moss Spring Graveyard Association: ACTIONS:

Approved the Joint Meeting of the Moss Spring Graveyard Association Directors and Session to begin at 7:18 pm. Approved contractor T. Byers Excavating to deliver up to two (2) truckloads of stone at \$500.00 per load and spread such by tailgating (truck bed slowly raised while moving forward to leave a defined layer of stone) to improve the right-of-way from Grant Street to and around the Moss Spring Cemetery. Approved memorial service on December 27, 2024, at 11:00 am. for Michael Schnebly with his ashes and the ashes of his mother, Elizabeth B. Schnebly, being scattered in the Cemetery's Scattering Garden. Approved the closure of the Joint Meeting and return to the Regular Session Meeting at 7:22 pm.

PASTOR'S COLUMN CONTINED

Of course—one dresses warm. But we all have enough winter outdoor clothes filling our closets. To see the snow glisten like diamonds is a beautiful sight. And when is the last time you helped your children or grandchildren make a snowman? One good thing to love about a February Walk in the woods is that the ticks are dormant!

February offers more indoor time. Binge watching TV is not such a great thing. However, many people do crafts, woodworking, whittling and other hobbies. These give us space to think deeply about our families, situations, our own soul and innumerable ways to do that inner work God is calling us to do.

February is also a time to think about what to plant in our gardens in the Spring. There is a great deal of joyful anticipation in browsing through a seed catalog with all those enticing pictures of what is to come in June, July and August. Whether you plan out a simple 8'x8' plot or a 30'x60' garden, seed catalogues give you hope! This year's garden will be the best ever! (If you don't garden but have even just a little space, this is a year to plan for it. It brings great rewards. But just one zucchini plant, please.)

February offers time to explore our history. If we don't learn from our history we are doomed to repeat it. We tend to spend much of our time trying to anticipate the future rather than remembering the past. With Black History Month and Presidents' Day, February is a time for us all to take a step back and reflect on our history as a country. Try exploring a President you have always admired or knew nothing about. Discover a new Black historical figure that transformed our world. If you have children, you can make these fun family projects this month to share together. GPC has the honor of being the spiritual home of the Rev. Dr. Matthew Anderson (1848-1928) You can go online to the local Allison-Antrim Museum to learn about him. Also, his older brother Moses began an organization that became the NAACP.

Better yet, plan a visit to the museum.

Within driving distance are many museums and galleries. The Pennsylvania State Museum is just an hour away in Harrisburg. The Washington County Museum, Maryland is less than 20 minutes away from Greencastle. The Walters Gallery in Baltimore is an easy day trip. These places will add to your mind and give you a deep appreciation of the history or beauty of our region.

As you deepen your knowledge and gain new experiences and insights, gather a group of friends and do a Bible study group together. Mornings, afternoons or evenings, there is space at the church building. If you prefer, an online group can readily be assembled with a modest amount of computer skill and free programs that will host your meeting online for free. That little computer can be a forum to learn about the history of the Christian Church, learn more about a book of the Bible, learn more about the types of prayer that will grow your soul.

Plan a day or several days of service. I highly recommend that you volunteer at the Cold Weather Shelter in Chambersburg. The Shelter is always in need of volunteers to do about a 3-hour shift, or prepare a meal for 25 people. Get to know these folks who have been homeless and be the hands of Jesus to them.

We can spend our February complaining about the weather or binge watch something on Netflix. But how does that grow your mind and soul? Embrace the season. Enjoy dressing for it. Celebrate those you love on Valentine's Day with a meal you learned to prepare. Go to Mount Vernon and walk where George Washington walked (it is an easy drive, too). Walk with the Lord as you deepen your prayer life and learn more from your study of scripture. Just don't be a couch potato.

And don't succumb to a bad case of the Februaries where you waste the month thinking of July. Don't waste your life on things you cannot change. Instead, embrace this time in your life and look for ways that February becomes a beautiful month where each day becomes a blessing.
