GPC Nominating Committee members will begin to meet to pray and discern who from this congregation will be asked to serve as an Elder, Deacon, or a member of the Nominating Committee.

In the reference handbook for Elders, Deacons, Pastor Nominating Committee, and the Congregational Nominating Committee which was Session Approved, December, 2021 (4th rev) it says...

“One of the convictions we take seriously at GPC is that God cares deeply about what goes on in this congregation. The members of the congregational nominating committee may ask you to consider serving but it is really God who calls people to serve. The Congregational Nominating committee members are merely acting as servants who try to sense God’s call for the church.”

Pray about how you may become involved in the ministry and leadership here at GPC. Discern God’s call in your life.

The 2026 Per Capita assessment includes \$11.26 for the General Assembly; \$2.40 for the Synod of the Trinity; and \$21.00 for the Presbytery of Carlisle bringing the **total per member to \$34.66**.

Martin Luther King Jr. Day is a national holiday established to honor the life and legacy of Dr. King, and to encourage all Americans to volunteer to improve their communities. It is observed on the third Monday of January each year to be close to (or on) Dr. King's birthday, which is January 15.

Dr. King was an American Baptist minister and activist, one of the most prominent leaders in the civil rights movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. He advanced civil rights for people of color in the United States through nonviolence and civil disobedience. Inspired by his Christian beliefs and the nonviolent activism of Mahatma Gandhi, he led targeted, nonviolent resistance against Jim Crow laws and other forms of discrimination.

In Franklin County, a variety of organizations host events in honor of the life Dr. King and his vision of creating a Beloved Community. The following website, managed by the Franklin County Coalition for Progress, provides a list of activities with links to many events.
