At its April meeting, the **Safety & Security Team** formulated a church door locking policy that was adopted by Session at its May 13th meeting. This policy is designed to ensure the continued safety of all those who worship and participate in the ministry of our church.

This policy will periodically be included in our weekly bulletin and monthly newsletters. |This policy will NOT be listed on the GPC website or placed on signage in the church.

*Since all church entry doors have panic hardware on the interior, each door will unlock from the inside even when locked to the outside.

POLICY:

During Sunday worship, the Opener/Closer, or designee, will lock all church entry doors, EXCEPT the handicap door near the elevator, during the Prelude. At 15-minutes past the hour, the handicapped door will be locked.

On Choir rehearsal nights, ONLY the parking lot door will be unlocked for attendees. The door will be unlocked 15-minutes prior to EACH scheduled rehearsal start time and be locked when the rehearsal begins.

When GPC committees and approved external groups are using other rooms for meetings, only ONE access door to the other rooms will be unlocked for attendees by the Group Leader. * All other church access doors should remain locked. The door will be unlocked 15-minutes prior to EACH scheduled meeting start time and will be locked when the meeting begins. In all cases, the access door will be locked when group exits church by Group Leader.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

REV. DR. ROBERT COOK *Interim Pastor*

“Consider the lilies in a field. They do not labor or spin and I tell you that not even Solomon and all his splendor was dressed like one of these.”

Matthew 6:28-29

I do daily walks with Benny, my dog, and as I was walking one morning, I was preoccupied by the events in my personal life. I thought of the troubles going on in this world, and in particular, I was troubled by the way that the people of Ukraine are suffering with this war that has no reason and seems to have no end. I try to be prayerful about these things, and I bring them before God regularly. In fact, every day. And yet they continued to weigh heavy on my mind.

But as I was walking, I experienced a realization that the air smelled so good. I started just taking big breaths of air because in this beautiful spring day

I was walking, it was as though I'd never experienced it before. I looked around and to see that the little Seven Sister's roses were in bloom. They have little delicate, white flowers. I saw the wild phlox with deep purple and lavender blossoms, just mere feet from where I stood. I noticed the wild blackberries were also blossoming with their intricate white petals that will give way to luscious blackberries in July.

I continued my walk with Benny, who walks very slow. Benny doesn't hurry as he is taking in all the scents from other dogs that have been there and



he loves it. I've walked there for years, but I just didn't really pay attention. That morning everything in the park had my attention.

I know we all tend to fret over one thing or another. We run from this thing to that thing. We worry over things that we probably can't change. But in that morning walk, I recognized the presence of God, all around me in the creation. I was amazed that it was right there in front of me and it was always there.

Now, I walk for my health and well-being and my body loves to walk. And Benny certainly loves to

walk. I'm not walking to get better at walking. I'm walking to slow down and to see the glory of God in the creation. I walk to let my mind relax from all the stuff that seems so important but is not really urgent at all. I thought of that verse from Matthew's gospel of how God takes care of the lilies of the field, which are so beautiful and intricate and so amazing. And they're there all the time we just don't see them. I think Jesus' point is to stop worrying and fighting to

see the hand of our Creator right in front of us who takes care of us too.

The spiritual practice of walking kind of unites your physical movement with your soul. And by slowing down, stepping out of the daily rush, we open our minds and our senses to see that we are in deep connection with our surroundings. We are a part of the creation as a part of us, and the creation is a part of us. When we understand this, we begin to understand our deep connection with God

Long ago Saint Augustine said "...it is solved by walking." He was on to something.

I also love the idea that God walks in the speed of our soul, which is about a three miles-per-hour walk. Life is not supposed to be a 75 mph drive on the interstate.

Jesus walked everywhere at three mph. He was so in touch with all creation. The people who walked with him also got in touch with God, with one another and with what God really wants for this world. It is good to look around to see the hand of God. To see our neighbors as people who God loves. Also to see needs so God can use us to touch or heal or bless. To know we are all deeply connected together.

I think we all would do well to walk more as we're able. I'm reminded that sometimes as we age, knees and hips and other things prevent us from taking long walks. But you can walk in your yard and see things you never saw before. In one place

where I lived some years ago, I got a book in the library that talked about wild plants and I found 42 or 43 different kinds of wild plants that all had names and I had no idea. I think I should go back to the library and find that book again.

So, what I'm suggesting is for us all to walk as much as we are able. We can see ourselves as perhaps small, as far as the vastness of the universe might be, but deeply loved by God our Creator; We can deepen our appreciation for this amazing creation that we are a part of. And we can know that God is always revealing something new as we open our eyes to see.

Clerk's Report: ACTION: Approved minutes of March 12, 2026 Regular Session Meeting.

Church Roll through March 31, 2026 is 132. Worship attendance on Easter Sunday, April 5, 2026 was 49 at the Sunrise Service and 3 joining Livestream. The traditional 10 am Worship Service attendance was 190 with Communion celebrated by 174 and 27 joining Livestream. On March 29, 2026, the 2025 Annual Reports were made available to members in preparation for the Annual Congregational Meeting scheduled for Sunday, April 12, 2026 as directed by our GPC Bylaws.

Finance: ACTIONS: Approved the following inclusive motion from the Finance Committee:

1. Reinstate payroll processing with pay periods ending on Fridays every other week. Over the weekend, or as soon as possible afterward, supervisors (Ruling Elders) should review and initial time cards for payment. Paychecks will be written on Mondays and be available on Tuesdays.
2. For Designated Accts:
 - A. Retain a small balance (e.g. \$5,000) of Uninvested Funds within checking account; move remainder to Short-term Investment-grade Fixed-income Securities, and distribute income to the General Fund on a monthly basis. (Invest Manager, Bookkeeper)
 - B. Presbyterian Women's Association (PWA): Liquidate from Designated Funds, return to PWA, not GPC organization. (Invest Manager)
 - C. Matthew Anderson Scholarship Fund: Establish Checking Account separate from Designated Funds (Clerk)
 - D. Schwab accounts: Reflect current Clerk as Officer of Record (Invest Manager)
 - E. Merge: Housing Fund into General Fund Endowment per earlier Session approval (Invest Manager)
 - F. Streamline: Assign one General Ledger code for each of these funds: General Endowment, Housing (to be eliminated once merged into general endowment), Designated, Matthew Anderson Scholarship Fund, and Moss Spring Graveyard Association Fund (Invest Manager, Bookkeeper)

ACTION: Approved Clerk of Session with signatory authority for Memoranda of Understanding.

Outreach and Mission: ACTIONS: Approved Presbyterian Women reserving the Social Room and Kitchen on Friday, May 15, 2026 from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm and the same on Saturday, May 16, 2026 from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm for a Tea Party Social with the theme "It Takes a Village". Approved the use of the Edwards Room on May 6, 2026 from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm for the Jean Widder Memorial Scholarship Committee. Erin Herrmann will be responsible for opening and closing the church. Approved the use of the Social Room on May 26, 2026 from 4:00 pm to 9:00 pm for the Myers Family for a baby shower for Hannah. Ami Myers will be responsible for opening and closing the church. Approved Graduation Sunday and Matthew Anderson Scholarship Presentations for Sunday, May 24, 2026. You may recall that GPC hosted the recent Greencastle-Antrim National Day of Prayer observance on May 7, in coordination with our nation's observance of this day of prayer. A series of Prayer Warriors prayed for various components of our nation.

Before entering into prayer for families, Pastor Fred Keener of the Greencastle Church of the Brethren on South Carlisle Street shared some information about Jonathan Edwards, the 18th century Presbyterian preacher. The name may sound familiar to you as we have a meeting room on the educational wing named in Pastor Edwards' honor - "The Edwards Room".

As we've just celebrated Mother's Day, many graduations, and are getting ready to celebrate Father's Day, and Grandparents Day later in the year, I wanted to share with you some background information Pastor Keener shared concerning the importance of prayer, discipline and Bible reading with families and impact of each practice on the future, our hope.

"Jonathan Edwards, along with his wife Sarah, raised 11 children in a home filled with prayer, Bible reading, and firm discipline. In 1900, American Educator A.E. Winship decided to trace the descendants of Jonathan Edwards over the course of five generations, and discovered that among 1,394 relatives, there were one U.S. Vice President [Aaron Burr], three Senators, three Governors, three Mayors, 13 College Presidents, 65 Professors, a Dean of a Law School and Dean of a Medical School, 100 Lawyers, 30 Judges, 60 Doctors, 75 Military Officers, 80 Public Office Holders, 100 Clergymen, and 285 College Graduates--leaders who shaped the moral and intellectual landscape of their day. The Edwards family is a testimony to God's faithfulness in the lives of those who put Him first!"

May you continue to share the love of Jesus with your family and others you hold dear.

Our group capped off an awesome year with some outdoor activities for its two meetings in May.

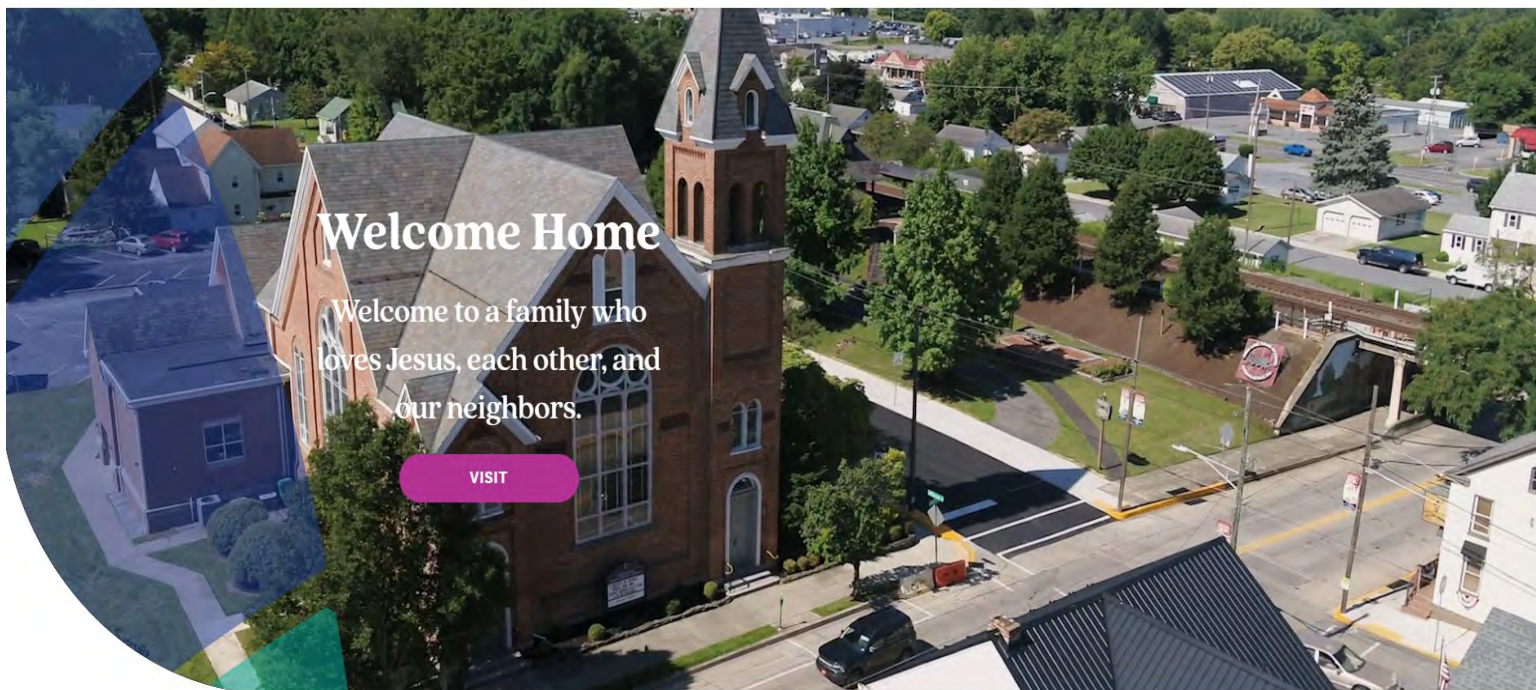
